# Pre-Nursery & Nursery


We learnt about opposites.

In Expressive Art and Design we acted out the traditional Snow White story. We worked as a team on a giant Snow White art piece, after which we discussed the benefits of teamwork.





# Year 5 & 6





In English, we worked in pairs and revised various grammar concepts together.
